Meet the New County Parks Leaders

Wo veteran park service professionals have joined the San Mateo County Parks, setting their sights on resource management, interpretive education, and open space conservation. Marlene Finley is now Director of San Mateo County Parks, following a 35-year career with the U.S. Forest Service and National Park Service, which included Muir Woods. Ramona Arechiga joins San Mateo County as Manager of Natural Resources after a ten-year career in natural resource conservation both in the U.S. and abroad. Marlene and Ramona have their work cut out for them. San Mateo has added hundreds of acres of parkland recently, from the newly opened Devil's Slide Trail in Pacifica to 174 acres in Loma Mar. Two immediate concerns they're focusing on are developing drought strategies with park rangers and stabilizing the county park finances.

Teacher Daran Reinholm on Huddart's Nature Hike Program

Slow down and experience nature with your children," says Daran Reinholm of Woodside Parents Nursery School. Every year, Daran takes her class of preschoolers, ages three and four, hiking in Huddart Park with docents from the Friends of Huddart and Wunderlich Parks. Daran herself has been a docent since 2004.

Daran says that experiencing nature is important for children for several important reasons. First, they need to feel safe in natural surroundings and be able to play outdoors with no fences. When children feel safe, it builds their confidence for engaging with the outer world.

Second, children need to know what's real. "We see so many toddlers playing with their parents' cell phones, and they do not know what is real and what is not real," says Daran. Recently Daran brought her pet chicken to school for the kids to see, and they kept asking, "Is it real?" Many young children are afraid of the woods, because they do not know the difference between the real world and fantastic creatures such as dinosaurs that they see on screen.

Third, it builds confidence if children are allowed to take the lead. "When hiking with young children," says Daran, "don't do too much talking. Just experience the woods with them; look at what they see, and listen to what they hear."

Teacher Harlin Hansen on the Folger Stable Program

ow the past connects to the present; that's what school kids who visit The Folger Stable in Wunderlich Park learn. To Harlin Hansen, third grade teacher at Woodside Elementary School, the field trip to the barn brings history to life for his own students.

"I've taken my class every year for three years," he says. "It's great because it's part of our community and is a valuable connection for us. One nice thing is the kids hear about what we learn in the classroom, like the Native Americans, from someone else. Our curriculum isn't tied to Woodside, but the field trip makes it more specific."

One lesson Hansen's students get is the relation between the Folger family and the Gold Rush. He likes that his students realize there were more ways to make a living than mining the actual gold; the people who supplied goods to the miners—like the Folgers--did very well for themselves. "It puts a little more perspective into what was happening in the 1850s and beyond," he says.

The hands-on aspect of the stable program is particularly worthwhile, Hansen says. Not only do the kids learn local history in relation to the bigger story, they can experience what life was like before today's conveniences—like transportation. "They [the docents] bring out a horse and talk about them. Some students don't usually see horses, so they get to see how to saddle one. They get a lot out of it."

Will Hansen bring back next year's crop of third graders? "We'll be there," he says.
